


The past few months have been a little slow in the new member department, so if you have a crewmember or that friend who might make a good member, now might be the time to make the membership pitch.

As many of you know, Ship 50 has been sponsored by the Sheboygan Yacht Club since 1932 and is the 26th oldest continously sponsored sea scout ship in the nation. We are a co-ed BSA Ship that offers watercraft instruction to scouts ages 14 through 20. We maintain a fleet of five Laser sailboats, eight kayaks & four stand-up paddleboards, a 18ft Cape Dory with access to six Vanguard 420's at Youth Sailing.

2023 was a great summer for our scouts! Our scouts have found they enjoy sailing our Cape Dory, "Griffin Dory" more than any other watercraft. Even though the Lasers are faster, the Dory is more stable and because of its size it accomodates four to five scouts at a time. They like to sail in groups. It promotes discussion of tactics, sail trim choices, safety considerations and whatever else they want to talk about. We also rotate job duties so all scouts get a chance to trim sails and steer. Details attached.

Our winter boatbuilding program continues as our scouts finished refurbishing all of our Lasers by replacing all damaged rigging, buffing out the hulls and even painting two hulls so they look like new. Our scouts are now re-building the two dock carts for the Club.

### SEAS UPDATE

Dear Friends and Supporters,

As I concluded the end of my third season as SEAS' Executive Director, I had an opportunity to reflect on SEAS progress from its inception 11 years ago to present. One primary example of this progress is SEAS' community boating program's continued growth as it provided 312 hours on the water and 376 hours of private lessons in 2023. SEAS is elated to have the opportunity to further its mission of "Boating for Everyone" through supplying its valuable resources to the community at an affordable and below-market cost.

SEAS adaptive program saw growth for the 5th straightyear providing 55 hours of sailing experiences to 120 participants. The adaptive program was even able to cross off a "bucket list" activity for Lew Harned, a 99-year-old WWII veteran, by getting him out sailing and making him our oldest sailor to date. He excitingly stated that he will be back next year to keep that title when he turns 100 years old. SEAS has also been able to rekindle its adaptive programs with RCS Empowers, Hearthstone of WI, and Aspire group of Sheboygan, all of which have been on hiatus since Covid. Building and growing these relationships allows SEAS to bring so many more people, who may not otherwise get to experience sailing, the enjoyment and feeling of freedom and independence that being out on the water gives them.

The "Seas the day" adaptive surfing project saw tremendous growth in 2023 with 16 participants. More equipment has been purchased for this program, and in light of the level of participation and enthusiasm for this program, the organizers are hoping to make this a 2-day event in 2024 to afford more adaptive surfers opportunities to enjoy the water.

Row Sheboygan saw fantastic growth with 32 people completing 23 rows that totaled over 50 hours on the water. The organization is actively seeking an increased number of rowers for the upcoming seasons.

The "Northstar" (SEAS 40ft. Tartan sailboat) competed again this year in the Chicago-Mac race with a 7-person crew. Three of this year's crew were participating for their first time in this historical race, adding even more excitement and making lasting memories during the multi-day competition.

As you can see, the 2023 season has seen growth in participants and its programs and provided valuable new opportunities and insight for the SEAS organization. SEAS wants to keep building on this momentum as it moves into 2024 and the organization needs YOUR HELP to achieve its' goals! SEAS keenly recognizes that these are challenging economic times, but we believe the organization is an important community program and asset that provides opportunities for everyone, regardless of socio-economic status, disabilities, or other barriers, to enjoy team building experiences and other unique opportunities that will create an everlasting appreciation of life on the water as well as an awareness for Sheboygan County's most important asset: Lake Michigan.


