# **Sheboygan High School Sailing**

Over the past fifteen years, high school sailing has been growing rapidly as a club and varsity sport across the country. In 2017, Sheboygan officially joined their ranks. High School Sailing is designed, like College Sailing, to turn the largely individual sport of dinghy sailing into a team sport. Most of the racing is done in 420s and at each event, a team must field a minimum of two boats (four sailors) who alternate racing in "A" and "B" Divisions. At the end of the event, the points between the two divisions are added up and the team with the lowest cumulative score wins the event. To get as much sailing in as possible, unlimited rotation of sailors is allowed with only a few rules, races run between 16 and 20 minutes, and there are no drops. That means a race committee may fun up to 32 (yes, 32!) races in one weekend to get 18 races per division. Entry is easy, as most venues provide their own boats, and fees are kept as low as possible.

Here in Sheboygan, we welcome sailors regardless of their experience level. We give them as much gear as we can provide to make it an accessible sport until they get the 'bug' and buy their own stuff. We have had sailors on the team

from Sheboygan North, South and Central High Schools, Sheboygan Christian, Sheboygan Falls, Plymouth, Kohler, and an assortment of middle schools across the Sheboygan Area School District. Over the past four semesters of sailing, the team has competed in just about 20 events and has traveled to Michigan, Chicago, Pewaukee, Lake Geneva, Big Cedar . . . the list goes on and on. Many of these sailors had their first attempt on the water in the snow last spring and still they come back for more! We are fortunate to have the facilities and support to bring the team to our lakefront. Thanks to everyone who makes it possible!

# Sheboygan High School Sailing from the perspective of an interested non-affiliated knowledgeable observer

The Sheboygan High School Sailing Team has just won the Wisconsin High School Championship sailed in Milwaukee at the end of May. What a wonderful tribute to all those who have made this happen. Today we have on the waterfront, a beautiful site to support all manner of sailing activity. This consists of infra-structure, facilities, well maintained boats, and a wonderful staff. All this is made possible by many generous knowledgeable donors, a supportive city, and the commitment from the Sheboygan Youth sailing Club board of directors. Contrast this to seventy years ago when that shoreline was a dusty parking lot and the Yacht Club was a hall with a screen porch and the beginnings of a permanent pier. Youth sailing consisted of a Club-sponsored Sea Scout organization for boys and a Mariner Scout program for girls. The Sea Scouts had a beat up old wooden Snipe with cotton sails. Sailing instruction was passed from the older sailors to the younger ones.

Fast forward to 2019. While driving along South Lakeshore Drive in April, I spotted a group of sails in the outer harbor and being naturally inquisitive, I asked about these goings on. I was informed that this was the High School Sailing team and was asked come in and observe. I regrettably never did but continued to observe from the warmth of my vehicle. These young sailors and their coach, all bundled up with wooly caps pulled down over their ears, practiced every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday throughout this miserable spring. Super dedication.

I came away with two indelible images. The first was a perfect start with all boats aligned on the starboard tack with each having a safe leeward on the windward competitor. And the second was a perfectly executed tack. Observing from the stern, the skipper put the helm down, moved into the center of the boat at head to wind, exchanged hands between tiller and main sheet and was up on the new high side as the boat filled away on the new tack. Could not have been better.

Sailing as a high school sport brings a lot more benefits to the participants than conventional sports. It is the introduction to a lifelong sport. It requires individual responsibility where the crew is in charge destiny. It requires an awareness of the situation, wind, waves the other competitors. And of course, it means the challenge of learning a new language, new rules, and the tactics and strategy needed to win. Then there are of course, the standard benefits of dedication, perseverance and the pursuit of excellence.

The success of team came from the eager sailors coupled with coaching of Whitney Kent. Whitney is a lifelong sailor, captain of her college inter collegiate sailing team, the Wisconsin Hoofers in Madison. Her teaching, encouragement and mentoring of these young athletes requires recognition.


