Our History

he first Club newsletter began in 1942 as a "letter from home" to SYC members scattered throughout the world due to World War II. At the membership meeting held December 11, 1941only a few days after Pearl Harbor-it was moved "that the Club offer its clubhouse and equipment to the Civilian Defense Committee in Sheboygan for the duration of the war." The membership approved a moratorium on dues for those on military duty and the Club participated in the formation of a Coast Guard Auxiliary unit which was to assist in the Civil Defense effort. At the height of the war in 1944, 26 of a total of 138 members were on active duty. EDITOR'S NOTE: Beginning with this issue, all future issues will be labeled with their respective volume and issue number.

About the Cover

COVER: This reproduction panoramic map of Sheboygan, Wisconsin was drawn by Henry Wellge and published by Norris, Wellge & Co. in 1885. Sheboygan, county seat for Sheboygan County, was settled in the mid-1800's on Lake Michigan at the mouth of the Sheboygan River, as a farming community raising wheat and cheese. With the addition of the port system, its railroad connections and its industrial craftsmen, Sheboygan earned the nickname "City of Cheese, Chairs and Children".


