


BLAST FROM THE PAST



From 1938 to 1946 food service at the Club was limited, with local caterers supplying dinners for major events. The Club hired Kenneth (Sandy) and Cordelia Sanders in February of 1946 to serve as the first Steward and Stewardess.

As part of their pay, the south wing of the Clubhouse (the original building) was remodeled for caretakers' quarters. "The Sanders' treated us all like family." Maynard Oleson remembers. He was a member of the informal "bachelors club" which frequently gathered for home cooked meals at the Club.

TRIBUTE TO PAINTER PETE

Pete Heimbold lived a half block from the Sheboygan lakefront and enjoyed spending time walking along the shoreline with his wife, Nancy. It was during these walks that Pete came up with a big idea of how he could give back to the community that he loved.

Pete's idea was to paint the benches along the shoreline because the benches "looked like hell". He approached the Sheboygan parks superintendent

and proposed his idea of volunteering his time to apply a much-needed fresh coat of paint to the benches. Pete would donate his time if the city would provide the paint.

Pete started at North Point and worked his way south, applying a fresh coat of paint to benches up and down the lakefront. There are 60 lakefront benches and he painted them every season for 12 years.

Pete enlisted his friends from SYC (John Visser and Rodger Feigel) to

help build a wagon to pull his paint supplies. And when the SYC members Gotwald boys needed volunteer hours for North HS honor society, Pete offered the opportunity to help paint the benches.

In April 2021 "Painter Pete" was awarded a Certificate of Appreciation and a dedicated bench in recognition for service to the community for 12 years of volunteer service. The bench was installed in the Fall of 2021, near the North Point Park in Pete's honor. Unfortunately, Pete did not have a chance to see the new bench with a plaque dedicated to his work and love for his community.

If you find yourself on the north end of the lakefront, take a moment to rest on Painter Pete's bench to enjoy the view and memories of Pete.












BAR STOOL RAFFLE WINNER!

SYSC 2022 - A Season In Review

his season was our best year yet! We've said that every year for quite awhile now, but it's been true every time. Rewind all the way back to early March – we were hard at work with some building improvements for the season. If you haven't been inside the SYSC yet this year, make sure to put it on your list before the boats are packed away – we can show off some of the talent of SYSC students and instructors through murals and storage solutions. Fast forward to now – it's late October, the gales of November came early, and we are still weeks away from shutting our doors on the season – a good time to reflect while the sun is still shining, and we aren't shoveling snow out of boats (yet).

Every season at SYSC flies by faster than the last (or maybe I'm just getting old), but this year brought with it some great moments spent with even better people. Some quick math tells some of the tale – we taught over 8,000 hours of lessons to almost

500 different people this vear! We launched our new Support Our Sailors (S.O.S.) Fund, which exists to provide financial assistance to sailors who may not otherwise be able to experience all our lakefront has to offer. We wrapped up our final year of the first cycle in the Siebel Sailors Program – a grant project through US Sailing that provided us with six new RS Fevas (the chartreuse sails

you see out there all summer long), staff training and support, and additional resources to increase our outreach into the community. We had a dedicated





and enthusiastic group of adult sailors, several of whom have since joined SYC and several more of whom are STILL out sailing in the evenings. Most importantly, we continued to focus on our core tenets – safety, fun, and learning – which help us to grow a strong community of students, staff, parents, friends, and supporters.

Thanks to all of you for your continued support of

everything we do at the Sheboygan Youth Sailing Center! So many of you have donated to our cause through time, money, expertise, gear, and spreading our name through town and we appreciate every bit of that. We will wrap up our adult classes at

the end of October and our high school team will compete at the Fall Championships in Chicago in mid-November, so until then, cheer us on from the cozy warmth of SYC and we hope to see you all at some winter programs in the months ahead!

The Sheboygan Youth Sailing Center and Sailing Education Association of Sheboygan recently announced their planned events for this upcoming fall, winter and spring. "Do you have any topics you want us to cover this winter? Let us know and stay tuned for more details!

November 11th (Friday) 6-7, SYC- 175th Anniversary of the Phoenix Disaster with Steve Radovan. Hosted by SEAS.

December 7th (Wednesday) 6-8, SEAS building-Knot Tying Workshop with Decorative Knot-Whitney - \$5/person – Join us at the SEAS Building 1837 Superior Ave for a festive and informative night of knot-tying! We will cover all of the basic knots you need to know to get on a sailboat and get the sails up and down and the boat back to the dock safely. We'll also learn the decorative Turk's Head knot and you will be able to take home an ornament, coaster, or bracelet along with a new skill!

January 4th – 6pm-8pm - Racing Rules of Sailing 101 - Ring in the New Year with the resolution to never be confused on the starting line of a sailboat race again! Ok, well, at least get to the course next year with a bit more confidence as we decode the basics of the Rule Book. Join Whitney as she breaks down the basics of the mysterious Racing Rules of Sailing. This course will be at SEAS for no cost.

January 18th 6pm – 8pm - Trivia Night- Seamanship Style- Join us for our first ever sailing-themed Trivia Night! We'll be spicing up some basic boating knowledge through our very own twist on the popular game. Bring a friend, you don't need to know anything about being on a boat to have a good time and learn something along the way! This will be held at the SYC for no cost.

February 1st (Wednesday) 6-8, SYC- Racing Rules of Sailing 102- In this 'next step' course, we'll dive deeper Into the Racing Rules of Sailing. Prep your questions and situations, and we will go through debunking some myths of the rule book and how to simplify your trip around the buoys!

February 15th (Wednesday) 6-8, SYC- Trivia Night

February 23rd (Thursday) 6-8, SYC-Ancient Navigation Join Captain Greg Farrell as he shares his research into some of the earliest known forms of navigation practice by our ancestors. How did they navigate before the sextant or, even earlier, without a compass? Find out in this interesting workshop!



March 1st (Wednesday) 6-8, SEAS- Splicing Workshop 101 – In this intro to splicing, we will cover when and why you need a splice vs a knot, what tools you need, and how to get started. This workshop will focus on the different aspects of anchoring and cover diverse topics from anchor designs to bottom types and will include anecdotes compiled from experienced cruisers.

March 29th (Wednesday) 6-8, SEAS- Basic Sail Trim w/Sailing Simulator- Matt

Designed for the newest sailors (even if you have never been on the water yet!) this course will begin with the basics of sail trim and the Points of Sail and will then include hands on experience with our sailing simulator!
